



When we speak of contentment, we are speaking of the state of being happy or satisfied.






"Godliness with contentment is great gain." 1 Timothy 6:6 NIV






"And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

Philippians 4:19 (NKJV)






Where there's anxiety, there's usually stress and contention; where there is contentment, there is usually peace and joy.





True contentment is a virtue that comes only from a transformed life.






The power comes from the Lord. Paul in verse 13 says, "Through Him who gives me strength." The NKJV says, "Through Christ who strengthens me."

Yes, He's More Than Enough!





Contentment empowers those who walk by faith to do the extraordinary. Paul writes in verse 13, "I can do <u>all this</u>..." The NKJV says, "I can do <u>all things</u>..."
